On October 6th and 7th [the Lahti University of Applied Sciences](#) and its very own student radio, [Limuradio](#) will host the 1st International Student Radio Conference, **ALTERNATIVES2016**. The conference is an opportunity for college, student and campus radio makers from all over the world to come together to hear and share experience with other colleagues, thinkers and doers from this unique, alternative media and learning environment.

The purpose of the conference is to provide the global college radio community a forum and a platform to get to know each other, to hear insights and ideas on student radio and find opportunities for worldwide co-operation.

The 2-day conference will consist of expert and practitioner speeches, workshops and networking activities.

The conference is supported by the Finnish Cultural Foundation and because of this grant there is no entry fee for the attendees.
